Erik Maitland, who reported weather at KWQC, the Quad-Cities' NBC affiliate, from 1993 to 2006, returned to the station and took over the top forecasting spot in

March 2011. Erik is our featured speaker at the July 27 meeting. His bio on the station's Website says he "enjoys speaking to school kids about weather and entertaining community groups with talks about weather, television, and his favorite subject: Erik Maitland!

While away from the QC, he was the weekend meteorologist at KMSP, Minneapolis-St. Paul. That's his hometown. He and his wife, Michele, have two daughters, Taylor and Eryn.

Erik studied meteorology and broadcasting at Arizona State University. After his first year forecasting in Phoenix, Erik has had stops in Traverse City, Mich., and Mason City, Iowa.

Assn. helps lowa's biotech companies

Since 1994, the Iowa Biotechnology Association has promoted the interests and growth of life sciences industries in Iowa, and its executive director, **Rachel Hurley**, provided some insight into its work at the July 20 meeting.

The association serves 547 Iowa companies that "use a living organism in some way," Rachel said. Those companies fall into three broad categories – Food & Agriculture, Industry & Environment and Health Care & Pharmaceuticals. As might be expected, more than 70% of those companies have something to do with corn, she said.

Still, they represent a tremendous diversity. Rachel profiled the work of several of them: breeding pigs that can

replicate human diseases, to aid in drug research... using corn starch to make the tiny structures that hold the fragrances in Febreze® and Bounce®.

Many of the companies make products that have been spun off of research at the University of Iowa and Iowa State University, Rachel said. One of those products, which will hit the market fairly soon, is cellulosic ethanol, made from the non-food parts of corn plants.
