Doxsie: 'Too many bowl games'

As he has for the previous three years, **Don Doxsie**, sports editor of the *Quad-City Times*, did some speculating about the 2011-12



College Bowl Season at the Dec. 21 meeting. "I want to thank the University of Iowa football program for giving me something to write about," he began, commenting on the suspension of running back Marcus Coker – "who accounted for 89% of the Hawkeyes' running yardage this season." Since Iowa was listed as a 16-point underdog to Oklahoma in the Insight Bowl before Coker's suspension, Doxsie said, "without him there's very little chance" of the Hawks winning. Still, he concluded, a bit wistfully, in 1984 Iowa beat Texas by more than 40 points.

There are too many bowl games, he said – 35 games, meaning 70 of the 120 teams in the NCAA bowl-eligible division will be playing. "Who would have thought there'd be a bowl game on Dec. 30 in Yankee Stadium?" he added – referring to Iowa State vs. Rutgers in the Pin Stripe Bowl. To further drive the point home, he noted 10 of the 12 Big Ten teams will be

in bowl games (he didn't say anything about the ironic arithmetic...). Illinois plays UCLA Dec. 31 in the Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl in San Francisco.

Answering questions from the club, Doxsie commented, "Early in the season I expected Wisconsin to be in the national-championship game – but I was surprised they lost two." As for that game, he said "Alabama can beat LSU this year because it has an offense. LSU has a great defense." He predicted a low score.
