1st Army readies all deploying troops

Brig. Gen. **Kendall W. Penn**, deputy commanding general of the First Army at the Rock Island Arsenal, provided a briefing on that command's mission of training, readiness and mobilization of all National Guard and Army Reserve units.

With two divisions – at Fort Mead, Md., and Fort Hood, Texas – the First Army during fiscal 2011 has trained some 70,000 soldiers, plus airmen and sailors with land-based assignments, for service in Iraq and Afghanistan, plus Kosovo, the Horn of Africa and as part of the multinational observer force in Egypt, Penn said. At the command's six training installations across the U.S., they learn "real-world techniques that are making a difference" when those soldiers must

carry out missions in harm's way, he said. Equally important, the command provides "de-mobilization" training to help returning Guard and Reserve troops return to civilian life.

As the U.S. military draws down its forces in Iraq and Afghanistan, Penn said, the First Army will continue to carry out the mission of training National Guard and Army Reserve units, he added.
