### Giving life skills to kids in foster care



**Kim Arnold** directs the AMP (Achieving Maximum Potential) program at Family Resources, on the Annie Wittenmyer campus in Davenport. For the May 30



meeting, she and her associate in the program, Margie Mitchell, introduced three youths, who are in foster care or other out-of-home placement program, who have benefitted

from their experiences with AMP.

AMP, according to the Family Resources Website, is "a youth-driven, statewide group that seeks to unleash the full potential for personal growth among foster and adoptive children in Iowa." It



offers "leadership opportunities, service learning projects, speaking opportunities, and educational/vocati onal assistance" and "provides the life skills youth need to become self-sufficient, independent adults."



All of that was just so many lifeless words until we met Miranda, 16, Scotty, also 16, and Heather, 18 on June 1. All are veterans of the foster system – and all three articulate, confident youth are also veterans of AMP.



Among them in their young lives they have endured parents who are drug or alcohol

abusers... the deaths of parents or grandparents (who had been the sole source of stability in their life)... being in the foster system virtually all their life... multiple family members in prison.

Thanks to AMP, they have been successful in high school and aspire to careers, such as counseling at a facility

like Wittenmyer, or an anesthesiologist... "and a surgeon, so I can do it all myself."
