An update on Project NOW in Rock Island

Community action agencies for nearly 50 years have been providing support and improvement for the poor and others who are too often forgotten in today's society. At the June 12 meeting, **Maureen "Mo" Hart**, executive director of Project NOW Inc., Community Action Agency, Rock Island, will provide an update on her agency and its impact on many of her city's residents.

Project NOW has been serving Rock Island, Henry and Mercer counties in Illinois since 1968, helping families with low incomes and seniors meet basic needs and improve their standard of living.

Project NOW, that is Neighborhood Outreach Work Inc., is one of more than 1000 community action agencies that serve nearly every county in America. They sprang from the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 to provide such services as Head Start, senior services, utility assistance, housing programs and homeless services. With headquarters in Rock Island, Project NOW also has offices in Moline, Kewanee and Aledo

The meeting opened...


