

What's at stake in Sept. 10 PPEL vote

A key issue on the ballot in the Sept. 10 election is a 10-year extension of the Bettendorf Community School District's Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL), which raises about \$1.9 million a year to maintain and upgrade existing school facilities, equipment and buses. Our own **Theron Schutte**, superintendent of the Bettendorf school system, explained what's at stake at the Aug. 21 meeting.

The election also involves election of three BCSD Board members, from among seven candidates. Theron advised members to read coverage of those races in QC news media. The PPEL fund has been in existence since 1975, consistently renewed by city voters. A "yes" vote would not raise property taxes, Theron explained – it would continue the existing property tax levy of \$1.34 per \$1,000 assessed valuation.

In the most recent decade, the PPEL has



funded major additions and renovations at Bettendorf High and Middle schools, Neil

Armstrong and Herbert Hoover elementary schools and the addition of the District Administrative Center on the high school campus. It has also paid for upgrades of facilities and equipment at all district schools, Theron said. Future projects include renovations, additions and upgrades of facilities at each school property in the district – properties worth \$147.7 million, occupying some 781,000 square feet of indoor space on 154 acres.
