Looking inside Alcoa \$300M expansion

Alcoa's \$300 million investment in its Davenport Works was recognized in 2012 by *Trade & Industry Development* magazine with a Corporate Investment and Community Impact Award.


At the time the award was announced, **Rob Woodall**, the Davenport Works director of manufacturing – and the featured speaker at our Oct. 23 meeting, said, "The use of aluminum by car makers is going to nearly double in the next 10 years and this is a strategic investment to capture that growth."

Alcoa was a winner in the corporate investment division of the magazine's awards for its Davenport Works expansion project, which will result in 150 new jobs, the retention of 200 existing jobs and 150 temporary construction jobs.

The expansion will house a new state-ofthe-art heat treatment line and a patented chemical treatment process that Alcoa has developed to improve adhesive bonding for vehicle assemblies.



Honoring Chuck; learning about PAX

Bettendorf Rotary took a "field trip" Oct. 16 to Ridgecrest Village in Davenport to honor **Chuck Mooney**, the club secretary 1957-2013 – and to hear about the experiences of **Anna Mohring**, an



exchange student from Münster, Germany, who is a sophomore at Sherrard High

School. The program was introduced by **Amber Castro**, who serves as the Quad-City community coordinator of the Program of Academic Exchange (PAX),

which brings about 1,100 students, ages 15-18, from some 70 countries to the U.S. to attend high school and live with a host family for a year.

"It's been a great experience," Anna said, to practice her English (which she has studied for seven years) and to learn more about American culture. As a result, since arriving in the U.S. this summer and traveling from New York City to Sherrard, where she lives with her host family – **Kim Dorsey**, her husband and daughter – she has become "more confident" in both the language and culture, she said.

After recounting the process of applying for the PAX program, and traveling from Germany to the U.S., Anna described some of the differences between life and school in the two countries:

In German high school, she said, "There are no extra-curricular activities – just studies." To learn how to play a musical instrument (she plays violin) or to participate in sports, or other pastimes, she enrolls in programs offered by her city of about 300,000 in northwest Germany.

"I like school spirit," from games played between schools, such as volleyball on Thursday evenings and football on Fridays, she commented. "I wish we had that in Germany."


