Mayor outlines 'State of City'

Mayor Bob Gallagher Jr. delivered the annual "State of the City" address on March 5, as the Bettendorf Rotary Club hosted members of the Iowa Quad Cities Rotary, Bettendorf Kiwanis, Quad Cities Chamber of Commerce and the Bettendorf Business Network at the Waterfront Convention Center.

Our own Mayor Bob outlined areas of progress that his administration has pursued over the past years, and will continue into the future to make Bettendorf "a more livable city."

The city, Bob said, has earned a Moody's Aa1 bond rating because of its "sound financial operations, healthy reserve and significant revenue flexibility...." With a



budget of about \$90 million for 2014-15, Bettendorf anticipates growth (see below) while keeping its status as the least expensive city in the QC, and the 3rd cheapest city in Iowa, in terms of fees for city services, he said.

To spur orderly growth and "open corridors to development," Bob enumerated a number of street and other infrastructure projects that will be completed this year. They include improvements to Forest Grove, Hopewell and Utica Ridge, 18th Street and Middle Road to the I-80 interchange. Storm and sanitary sewers will be upgraded in



conjunction with related work in Davenport, he added.

The effort to grow current business and attract more new businesses saw 168 building permits issued last year, Bob

said. "We anticipate more this year," he said. He cited improvements in many parts of the city last year – the Duck

Creek Mall area, the Family Museum and Cumberland Square area. He added in such recent developments and announcements as the replacement of Home Ridge Suites by a Hilton hotel, conversion of The Lodge to a Double Tree Hotel and the prospect of major projects, including a sports complex, business complex, residential subdivision, school and park, where Middle Road intersects I-80.

The riverfront and downtown, disrupted in the next few years by the I-74 bridge project, are targeted as "a destination for entertainment and living," Bob said. The utility infrastructure is being upgraded as bridge-related projects permit, street-scaping is being improved and amenities, such as a new park across from the Waterfront Convention Center, are being added, he said.

All of these areas of development, Bob concluded, make Bettendorf "the premier place to live in the Quad Cities.... We're working hard to achieve our goals."
