Dad, son star in 'Mr. & Me' strip

Jason Platt, the speaker at our Dec. 3 meeting, was billed as a "cartoonist, artist, actor and father..." But when he began to speak, it quickly became apparent (pun intended) that he was going to concentrate on the first and last words in that list.

Jason – while nevertheless being all of the other words on the list plus some others, like "playwright" – is the creator of a cartoon strip, "Mister & Me", which takes a usually light-hearted, yet often poignant look at life from the perspective of



a single father of a young son (see "History with Harry," below).

It all began when his son Wyeth was 3 and he created an illustrated book of

poems for him, Jason said. Over the 8 years since, the concept morphed into a comic strip – which appears on his Web site, www.mister-and-me.com. "They're



not 'knee-slapping' funny," Jason said, "but more personal, dealing with issues like divorce and being a single dad and other parent-child interactions."

Being a Quad-Citian, Jason incorporates local places – a glimpse of the Centennial Bridge, a reference to a favorite eatery – and names of friends into "M&M" strips. His acting experience informs dialog in the strip – and vice versa – as he explores life lessons of all sorts (in one strip, two kids on the playground realize "there's no more recess after 5th grade").

Interested in drawing since an early age, Jason nourished his talent at Black Hawk College and the Savannah (Ga.) School of Design. He creates about one strip a week – which "takes about 4 hours from pencil sketch to finished ink" – striving for what he describes as a M-A-S-H-like combination of "funny and heavy."

On Sept. 17, 2012, cartoonist Jason Platt's "Mister and Me" comic strip hero was sitting at his drawing board feeling exactly like I did this morning: "Gotta meet the deadline... gotta meet the deadline."

I had a few decades of Rotary minutes in front of me... and by December of each year **Chuck Mooney**'s typewriter ribbon was so faint I had to squint. Connecting club history through the decades was just not happening for me today. "Gotta meet the deadline." OK... push...

Hmmm... Chuck Miller lost his hat, a Dobbs size 7½, after the club Christmas party in 1962! Fail. We donated money for a bunch of Christmas baskets. Try a couple decades later. OK... two Rotarians, both named Chuck, none of them "Mooney," were cleared of all securities charges by a Davenport federal judge around this time of year a while back. Hmm... not your typical Christmas story... and... Christmas baskets.

"Gotta meet the deadline"... Jason's hero, "Mister," like me, sank a little closer to the desk... pencil in hand... "Gotta meet the deadline..."

Maybe the '70s. Our club Christmas party was at Circa '21 in 1977! Woohoo... more Christmas baskets. How about '95? Chris Stengo donated an automatic thermostat to a Christmas auction!! Dance and sing!! Baskets again.

"Gotta meet..."
Finally Jason's character was... out cold at his desk. The comic strip ended there. But if there was more room on the page, I think it would have shown his hero "Mister" waking up inspired by what he needed, hiding in plain sight... Let's see... carry the 4....
