## **Venture School to aid QC area entrepreneurs**

Jennifer Ott, University of Iowa Venture School (thanks to Dimy Doresca) Venture School, a six-week program for entrepreneurs, is coming to the Quad Cities in March, and **Jennifer Ott** of the University of Iowa’s Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center will tell us more about it at the Feb. 4 meeting – at the Davenport Country Club.



Venture School “increases the chances of startup success and accelerates the timeline to launch, all through experiential learning activities

including customer research, insight from experienced entrepreneurs, and workshops,” according to a QC Chamber promotion. Venture School will take place March 3-April 17.

Eastern Iowa Community Colleges and the Quad Cities Chamber partnered with the University of Iowa John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center to bring Venture School to the region. Businesses, start-ups and entrepreneurs throughout the Iowa and Illinois Quad Cities region can participate in the program.

## **BRC grants \$25K To 15 charities**

Dispensing with most of the usual aspects of a Bettendorf Rotary Club meeting, **President Sharon Sarver** called District 6000 Assistant Governor **Doug Petersen** (Iowa Quad-Cities Rotary) to the rostrum. Doug extended greetings from **District Governor John Ockenfels** and congratulated BRC on its community service through its charitable grants.

Moving towards presentation of those grants, **President Sharon** thanked all of the sponsors of the 2014 LobsterFest for their generous support and acknowledged the vital roles played by such partners as Rivermont Collegiate, site of the event, and the culinary arts program at Scott Community College, whose faculty and students prepare the food.

She then introduced **Jeff Hassel**, chair of the BRC Charitable Giving Board, who in turn introduced members of that board who assisted in making the grant

presentations: **Ann Kappeler, Kevin Kraft, Ralph Heninger, Chelsea Powers and President Sharon.**

Jeff noted this year's 15 grants total \$25,000 – the highest total to date. Funds for these grants come from the 7<sup>th</sup> annual BRC LobsterFest; this year's event is scheduled for Saturday, June 13.

equipment to aid aircraft flight operations and aerospace education for cadets ages 12-20.

→**Dress for Success Quad Cities:** With its clientele growing by 40% last year, Dress for Success will use its \$2,000 grant to buy shoes for limited-resource

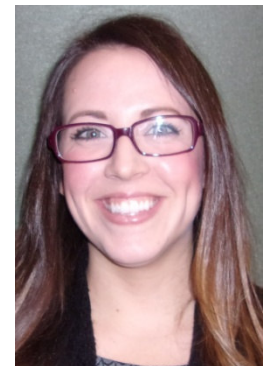
women entering the workforce, **Regina Haddock** said.

**Hendershott** said the \$2,000 grant will help fund Family Nights, events to strengthen family bonding.



→**Gilda's Club Quad Cities:** The new Cancer to Health program will provide education on a healthier diet and exercise to help club members deal with all the stresses of cancer and its treatment, thanks to the \$1,750 grant, according to **Paige Nagle.**



→**Habitat for Humanity Quad Cities: Dougal Nelson** said the \$1,000 grant will help pay for construction of a simple, decent, affordable home for a QC family.

**Development Center:** the center's reception area will receive a much-needed repainting and refurbishing, said **Jeff Ashcraft** in thanking BRC for the \$1,000 grant.

**Joe Tirone** and **Teri Johnson** reported the Patriot Place Veterans Resource



Center will use the \$2,500 grant to help QC area veterans in many ways as they transition from the service to civilian life.



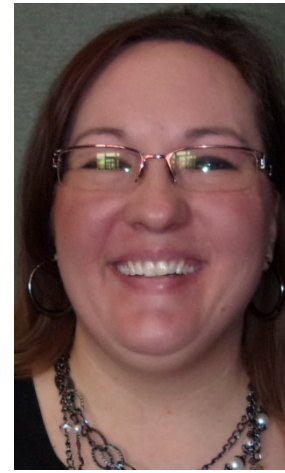
→**King's Harvest:** The Homeless Overflow Shelter can now afford an additional staff person to help feed and shelter homeless men, women and children Dec. 1- April 15, thanks to

the \$2,500 grant, according to **Margot Hary**.



In addition to grants to QC charities, BRC presents \$7,000 in scholarships to grads of Bettendorf high schools and Scott Community College.

→**New Kingdom Trailriders:** **Angie Nelson** said the \$2,000 grant will help pay for a new facility – barn and 30 acres – which will enable year-round programs.



→**People Uniting Neighbors & Churches (PUNCH):** **Rev. Craig Anglin** said the \$1,000 grant will help winterize homes in the Davenport Hilltop residential community.



→**QC United: Ruben Moore** and **Kim Riley Quinn** will use the \$1,000 grant to enable Pete the Purple Bull to teach more groups the social and emotional skills needed to counteract bullying.



**LobsterFest 2015 – the evening of Saturday, June 13 – will bring 300 fresh lobsters from New England to the QC...**



→ **Quad City Marathon: Joe Moreno** reported the \$1,500 grant will cover the entry fees for 150 low-income children to participate in QCM's micro-marathon.



→ **Quad City Symphony Orchestra Association:**

Musicians from the QCSO can go into Bettendorf elementary schools as part of their music education program, thanks to the \$2,000 grant,

said **Ben Klemme**.



→ **St. Mark Lutheran Church Food Pantry:** the \$2,500 grant will buy two months' food for hungry families who use the pantry, said **Linda Cook**, who

added, "If you bought a ticket (to the

LobsterFest), you've fed someone today."

In summing up the afternoon's grant presentations, **President Sharon** commented, "It's humbling to be able to help create an impact" in the community... "We lit up Rotary today."

### **Rotary releases \$34.8M to fight polio worldwide**

Rotary International released an additional \$34.8 million in grants to support polio immunization activities in 10 countries, including Afghanistan, Nigeria and Pakistan, the three countries where the disease has never been stopped.

The funds, whose release was announced 20 January, will be used by the World Health Organization and UNICEF for

polio immunization and surveillance activities in the 10 countries, as well as to provide technical assistance in several other countries in Africa.

The grants include \$8.1 million for Nigeria to support its final push to eradicate the disease. Nigeria experienced a nearly 90 percent reduction in cases in 2014 compared with the previous year, and hasn’t registered a new case of polio in the last six months.

One less promising spot in the polio eradication fight has been Pakistan, which saw an explosive outbreak totaling more than 300 cases in 2014, the most there in more than a decade. Pakistan will receive \$1.1 million of the funds that Rotary is releasing to support eradication efforts there.

In addition, the grants include \$6.7 million in Afghanistan, \$7 million in Somalia, \$3.3 million in Democratic Republic of Congo, \$2.8 million in Niger, \$2.5 million in Chad, \$1.6 million in Cameroun, \$1.1 million in Ethiopia, and \$250,000 in Kenya. A total of \$321,000 will provide technical assistance in Africa.

To date, Rotary has contributed more than \$1.3 billion to fight polio.
