We roll up our sleeves to do some landscaping...

Instead of a regular meeting on May 6 we'll go to the **Handicapped Development Center facility at 2700 Linwood Court, Davenport**, for box lunches and a "done-in-a-day" landscaping project. (A few members will split off for a second landscaping project at an inner-city apartment building owned by the Ecumenical Housing Development Group.)



Remember to come dressed to do landscaping work. Bring your own gloves, shovel, rake and other yard-work tools that you anticipate you might need.

To reach the HDC's Linwood Court facility, take Northwest Boulevard to its intersection with North Pine Street. Turn south on North Pine to West 63rd Street (the first intersection). Go west on 63rd to Jebens Avenue and turn right. Linwood Court is the first right on Jebens.

The **May 13 meeting** will return to **Tanglewood Pavilion**, where we'll welcome **Brad Scott of the Scott Community College Culinary Arts Program** – the crew we have to thank for much of the delicious fare at LobsterFest.

A look at 'cool' QC Regional Vision...

Looking to advance the Quad City region in a more coordinated way, a task force comprising business, non-profit and public-sector leaders has been working hard to develop a Regional Vision. At the April 29 meeting **Kent Pilcher**, president of Estes Construction and a leader of the Regional Vision process, gave us some insights into the process and its objectives.

With the goal of transforming the QC region into "a **cool, creative and prosperous place to live and work,**" to attract talented people and employers, the group – which now includes some 145 organizations – faced the No. 1 problem

of “unaligned thinking” and individual agendas for the cities and counties within the region.

So, Kent said, the group has been striving to reach that unity and alignment. One



breakthrough, he said, was the comment by one group member that “we ought to think of ourselves as New Yorkers do – we’re each in a ‘borough’ but we’re all part of the same city.” That thinking, Kent added, led to the realization that each city

or county in the region should continue to develop its own individual plans and programs – but realize that they all contribute to the advancement of the whole region.

The Regional Vision group is working systematically in four phases to create – and then implement – a unified plan that will take the region forward to 2030. The process will take the leadership of the region from developing the vision; to

aligning their thinking, speaking and behavior; shifting the culture to embrace the vision and strategy to achieve it, and finally implementing the plan.



Kent said he is encouraged that “there’s lots of

energy” already behind this movement. A request for citizen input brought more than 3,500 responses – nearly double the expected response – and the 3,000 members of the QC Chamber’s Young Professionals group are solidly behind the effort, he said.

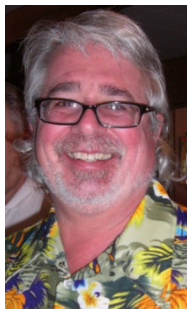

Laurie says the keys to success are: "never believing I'll fail, my tenacity and my desire to see things through."

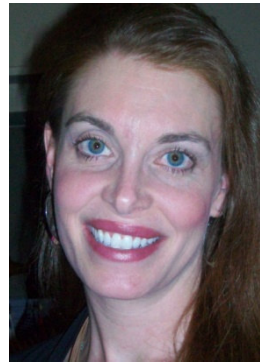
She gets excited when she reveals that if she could have any other job she'd like to be a talk-show host!
