**Santee exiates on Spelling Bee**

**Santee Jo Luster** has been coordinating the Quad-City Regional Spelling Bee – which covers Scott, Rock Island, Henry and Mercer counties – for 44 years. It’s one of thousands of first steps in the Scripps National Spelling Bee – for the best spellers in 8<sup>th</sup> grade and younger – from across the U.S., its territories, Defense Department schools in Europe; also, the Bahamas, Canada, China, Ghana, Jamaica, Japan and South Korea.

At the June 3 meeting she related some stories from her years as the area coordinator and chaperone for the winner of the QC contest, who competes at the national bee in a suburb of Washington, D.C. From the 20-plus million who begin the process, 285 kids reach the final. In preliminary rounds of the 3-day national

championship, that number is whittled down through a series of spoken and written spelling and vocabulary quizzes.

Sandee introduced **Uma Kasichainula**, the local 2015 champion, a 6<sup>th</sup> grader at Hopewell Elementary School in Pleasant Valley.

As Sandee randomly selected words for the members present to define or spell, she relied on Uma to provide both the correct spelling and the proper pronunciation. To test whether you're as smart as an 8<sup>th</sup> grade spelling bee contestant, here are examples from the 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> round vocabulary tests:

- 'expiate'
- 'abstemious'
- 'viridigenous'
- 'epithalamium'
- 'toploftical'

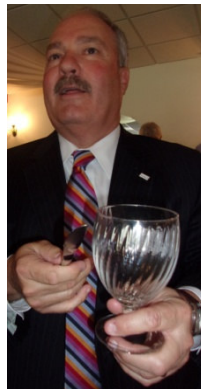
**Carl Loweth** – happy to introduce his daughter to the club – and have her update wife Rona’s health progress...
