U of I Mobile Museum


The idea was simple: to make Iowans more aware of their history and heritage, take the messages to them.

That idea – borne out of meetings among the University of Iowa Vice President for Research and Development, the Pentacrest Museums, and the State Archaeologist – led to the U of I Mobile Museum, which visited Bettendorf Rotary for the Sept. 2 meeting. **J.C. Gillett**, the Mobile Museum's educator, described what has happened since then:

→Winnebago Industries of Forest City, Iowa, built a custom recreational vehicle to carry and display the museum exhibits.



- → The first year of the Mobile Museum's operation, 2014, exhibits of Iowa's prehistory, the archeology of early settlers and a focus on the Old Capitol in Iowa City drew 33,000 visitors.
- →Now in its second year, all new exhibits focus more on the University and its impacts on society in Iowa and beyond in one case, way, way beyond:
- "Water Underground" examines Iowa's crucial water resource groundwater, the aquifer system beneath the state, the water we drink and its key role in the state's agriculture.



"Hawkeyes in Space" documents the work of Dr. James Van Allen in discovering the radiation belts named for him that surround the Earth and much more since then. "Iowa has been involved in more than 100 space missions," J.C. said including the

Voyager 1 mission that just last month passed by the dwarf planet Pluto and became the first man-made object ever to leave our Solar System. Related exhibits on radiation, magnetism and other aspects of physics contain some delights and surprises; for example, **Harry Coin** and **Rich James** learned that orange Fiesta Ware from the 1930s is slightly radioactive because that color glaze contains uranium oxide.

"Over Here / Over There" follows one Iowa family during World War II: while the husband served in the military the wife set up a daycare service to care for the children of young mothers who worked in war industries.

- **→** About the Bettendorf Rotary Foundation: President Kevin explained how money flows through the BR Foundation to fund the club's charitable giving and scholarship programs. The Foundation maintains two funds at the Community Foundation, which administers ours and many other foundations in the community: "The Bettendorf Rotary Foundation Agency Fund accepts contributions from the club" as a whole, Kevin said. It maintains a balance of about \$100,000 – with some fluctuations due to market dynamics. The second fund, the Bettendorf Rotary Foundation Fund, "accepts donations from individual members," he explained. With its balance of about \$50,000, it funds the club's grants to not-for-profit organizations in the community and its scholarships to graduates of Bettendorf and Pleasant Valley high schools, Rivermont Collegiate and Scott Community College.
