CSI: Bettendorf – how BPD investigates crime

OK, maybe it won't be exactly like the CSI TV franchise, but Bettendorf Police Chief **Phil Reddington's** department will provide a look inside the city's crime-investigation process at the Feb. 3 meeting.



According to the BPD Website, the department is divided into two divisions:
→Field: patrol, communications,

traffic, training, community service officer and crossing guards
→Support: records, identification, investigations, data entry, evidence, social worker (Bettendorf is the only Iowa police department with one), school liaison, chaplains and Metropolitan Enforcement Group.

Investigations and evidence services come into the picture when officers must collect and analyze evidence of a crime.

BRC gives \$22.5K to QC non-profits

Bettendorf Rotary, through its Charitable Giving Board, awarded a total of \$22,500 during the Jan. 27 meeting to 12 not-for-profit projects that serve the Quad City community.

It was seventh year that proceeds from the annual Bettendorf Rotary LobsterFest at Rivermont Collegiate generated the funds for those grants.

“We received 39 requests for a total of \$81,849,” said **Jeff Hassel**, chair of the Charitable Giving Board. “The club was able to fund 12 requests totaling \$22,500 or 28 percent of the total requested. We hope our next LobsterFest on June 11 enables us to reach an even higher level of support for 2016.”



Bettendorf Rotary also presents \$7,000 in scholarships to graduates of Bettendorf and Pleasant Valley high schools, Rivermont Collegiate and Scott Community College who are going on to higher education.

Asbury Methodist Church – Garden Ministry: The Garden Ministry began in the spring of 2002 as an outreach ministry to provide fresh vegetables to persons in the QC

who otherwise would not have access to them. Project representative **Dave Phillips** accepted the **\$2,500** grant.



Bettendorf Public Library – Outdoor Chess at the Library: To enable the fabrication and installation of two steel ADA-accessible chess tables outside at the Bettendorf Public Library. They will be installed outside of Dewey’s Café and at Faye’s Field. The grant will also pay for 10 chess sets available for patrons. **Ami Wells** of the BPL Foundation received the **\$2,500** grant.

Boy Scouts of America – Kittan (Scott County) Day Camp: This 5-day camp

provides boys in grades 1-5 with learning and leadership experiences in a controlled and safe environment.

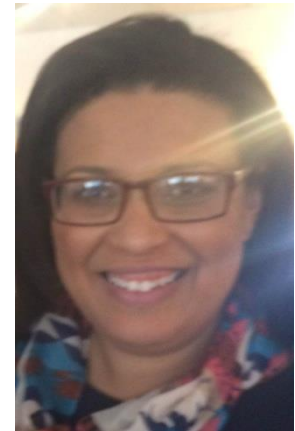

Prevention: To focus on prevention, the Stewards of Children program will purchase educational materials to support programming to Quad Cities

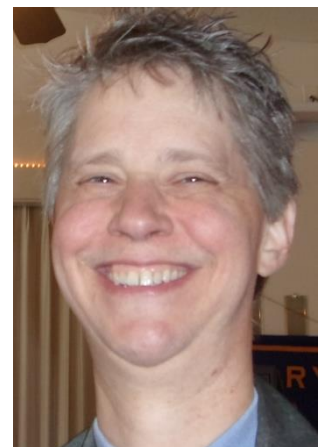

performance and social skills. Program director **Joyce Klopp** accepted the \$2,000 grant for this program that separated from the national Lydia House program to concentrate on QC needs.



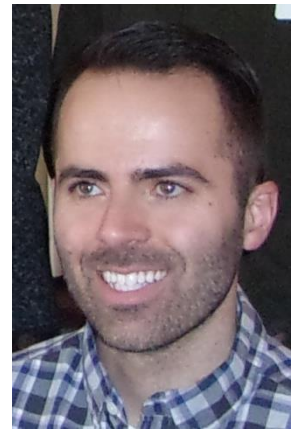
From Cover to Cover – Snuggle Up and Read Campaign:
