the Quad Cities and Iowa City.


The CES program offers free energy assessments to business owners as well as expertise on rebates and programs to help businesses make energy efficiency upgrades.

JDC raised \$87M to help charities

It's 18 days until the John Deere Classic, one of 47 annual events on the Professional Golfers Association tour. And its director for the last 14 years, **Clair Peterson**, provided a wealth of information on the event at the July 20 meeting.

As a not-for-profit organization, Clair said, the JDC exists to raise money for Quad-City charities and, while doing that, promote volunteerism and tourism to the community.

The event raised \$87 million last year to benefit charities – and *all* of that money went to the charities, since John Deere pays the salaries of its employees who

are on loan to the Classic. Charitysupporting funds come from tournament revenues and donations from corporations and individuals. Bonus



money for charities comes from Birdies for Charity, in which

donors pledge to donate an amount for each birdie the pros make. To spur participation, donors can guess the total number of birdies and one will win a raffle for a two-year lease on a Lexus.

Prize money at this year's JDC will total \$4.8 million with 18% going to the winner, Clair said.

As it has in other recent years, last year the QC received the PGA's Most Engaged Community award for the level of its support of local charities – which, Clair said, equates to \$23 for each person in the QC. About 1,750 community volunteers worked on the event, a record, he added.

When the 156 professional golfers – plus caddies, tour officials, out-of-town fans, media and others – have finished their stay in the QC, Clair said they will have had a \$52 million impact on the local economy.



The 2016 John Deere Classic runs Aug. 8-14 at TPC Deere Run, a one-time shift to accommodate the return of golf to the Olympic Games. In

2017 and beyond, the John Deere Classic will return to its normal early-July dates.
