Learn about benefits of Salt Holistic Therapy

Dr. Amanda Friemel, a 2003 graduate of Palmer College of Chiropractic, operates Friemel Chiropractic and SALT Holistic Health on Valley Drive in Bettendorf. She is the scheduled speaker at the Aug. 10 meeting.



“Our mission is to provide alternatives to allow your body to function at its optimum and reach your own innate potential,” according to her Website. “We offer chiropractic care, acupuncture, massage, and halotherapy.”

Halotherapy, or salt therapy, uses a halogenerator to grind up pharmaceutical grade salt into an aerosol that is dispersed into the air. She says it may help, among other benefits, to:

- Reduce the need for inhaler and/or nebulizer treatments
- Clear mucus and phlegm from lungs
- Improve and strengthen the immune system
- Alleviate breathing issues
- Minimize skin irritations

QC United Way refocuses goals

After completing his 27th United Way campaign – in cities in South and North Dakota and Tennessee, as well as the QC – **Scott Crane**, president of United Way of the Quad Cities Area, told us at the Aug. 3 meeting how United Way is changing – and why.

“The biggest issue in the community is poverty,” he said. And the United Way is shifting its way of serving the community’s needs accordingly.

Traditionally, the organization would collect donations (last year’s campaign raised about \$9 million, he said) from throughout the community – and disperse it to 85 charities to help them meet their individual programs’ needs.



Now, United Way is pivoting to focus its efforts – and spending – to make improvements in three broad areas: education, income and health. Some

UW programs in those areas already exist, he noted:

→Imagination Library, an 8-year-old program, gives a free book per month to kids up to age 5 in families that meet low-income criteria

→The Kindergarten Readiness program (4 years old) helps the 1 in 6 kids in the QC who aren't yet ready for school – “and that's 1 in 4 if they're low-income,” Scott said

→UW brought 13 AmeriCorps volunteers to the Iowa QC to add to help ensure 3rd graders can read at grade-level. “That's the grade when they should be finished learning to read – and beginning to read to learn,” he said.

A newer program supplies IRS-trained volunteers to help low-income families prepare their tax returns. And “Last year we invested \$75,000 in a mental-health assistance program to provide respite care,” he added.

Some organizations that supply volunteers already have goals related to education, health or income, Scott said, and United Way works to blend the organization's goal into the community's goals in those areas.

In the area of income, United Way will soon have a financial resources center to help people “the rest of the way toward financial self-sufficiency,” he said.

To use its own funds more wisely, UW recently purchased an office – the 4th floor of the Triumph Community Bank building in Bettendorf. At the end of the 10 years it will take to pay off that purchase, “we'll put \$50,000 a year (which we used to pay for rent) back into the community,” Scott said.
