Friendly House programs**

Terry Hendershott, assistant director of the Friendly House, Davenport, is the scheduled speaker at the Aug. 17 meeting.

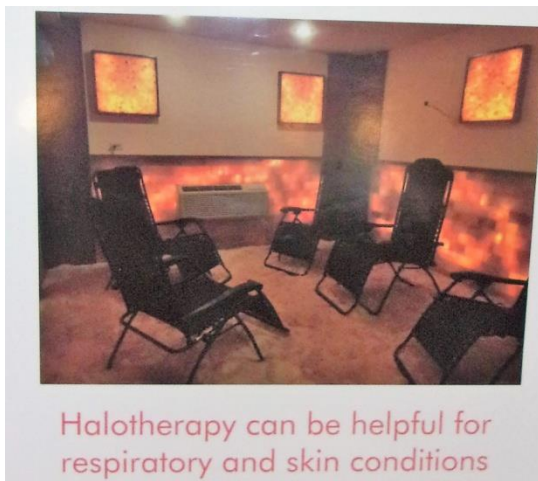
**Salt therapy aids
ailing lungs, skin**

Dr. Amanda Friemel, who operates Friemel Chiropractic and SALT Holistic Health on Valley Drive in Bettendorf, described the benefits of halotherapy, or salt therapy, at the Aug. 10 meeting.

Amanda turned to the salt treatment as a therapy for her son with asthma, because she didn't like the notion of having him constantly under medication. Halotherapy improved his condition so much, she said, that “there have been no more emergency-room trips since.” That experience led to creation of the Salt Room at her clinic.

The Salt Room, which can accommodate up to five patients at a time, is built using Himalayan-salt bricks in the floor and walls.

In halotherapy, a device called a halogenerator grinds pharmaceutical-grade salt into “negatively charged ions, which are released into the air and then inhaled,” according to a flyer available at the meeting. It continued, “These negative ions attach to the positive ions



(toxins) in the body, neutralizing the charge, thus promoting detoxification (similar to a Neti-Pot, but for your lungs).” Amanda said halotherapy is beneficial in less-serious lung ailments and dermatological problems.
