**Club Assembly –  
looking ahead**

Once a year the new president presents a detailed look at where Bettendorf Rotary stands – and where it's headed over the remaining months in the president's term. The Aug. 31 meeting was **President Jonna Schuler's** turn, and, after introducing the members of this year's Board, she shared some highlights of the 2016-17 year:

The budget – where our funds come from – and the services we perform for communities, from Bettendorf to international places that need help, are closely interrelated. On the income side of the budget, BRC expects to derive funds from dues (\$77,000), LobsterFest (\$63,000), Jon Ryan Happy \$\$ (nearly \$13,000 to mark birthdays, anniversaries and other happiness), the annual Golf Outing (\$5,000) and various smaller

sources. Our current membership of 103 (with a goal of adding 10-12 more this year, Jonna said) pays dues of \$55 per month, which is divided among district dues, weekly lunches, a subscription to *The Rotarian* magazine, administrative costs – and \$25 per quarter towards attaining a Paul Harris Fellowship for each member.

On the expense side, the club's money managers have to pay a certain number of bills each year: meals; dues and

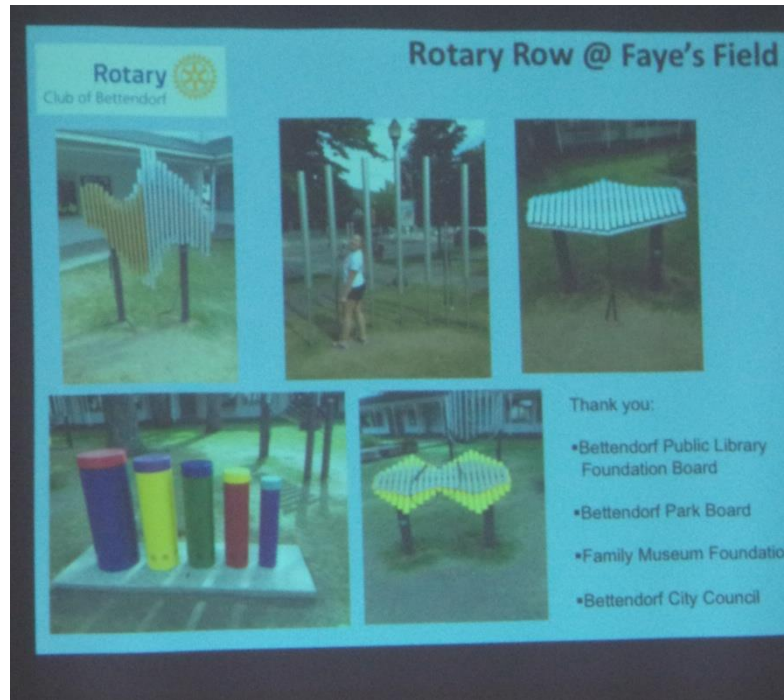


contributions to Rotary Foundation, Rotary International and Rotary District 6000; LobsterFest expenses; contributions to the Bettendorf Rotary Foundation; and administrative costs, such as the club secretary's salary, Website fees and other costs of doing business.

The remainder will provide services to Bettendorf, the Quad-Cities, the state, nation and internationally, including:

- QC Charitable Giving Grants – currently at least \$25,000 annually to not-for-profits throughout the community
- Thanksgiving and Christmas food baskets to local families in need
- Bettendorf Rotary Scholarships (to grads of Bettendorf and Pleasant Valley high schools, Rivermont Collegiate and Scott Community College)
- Run with Carl (scholarships to BHS and PVHS grads)
- Dictionaries given to every 4<sup>th</sup> grade pupil in the city of Bettendorf
- PolioPlus, the fight to eradicate this disease worldwide

- An international project, such as the current Boulmier Water Project to bring potable water to a Haitian village
- Community Service Grants – bike racks along the Duck Creek Recreation Trail last year, and Rotary Row at Faye's Field (see below) this year
- New Member Projects, chosen by each year's "class" of new BRC members
- RYLA, in which we send selected BHS and PVHS students to the week-long Rotary Youth Leadership Academy for students throughout Iowa
- A one-day-and-done "Betten-Do" project, such as cleaning up the streets in our meeting "neighborhood"
- Sponsorship of the MAC (Mississippi Athletic Conference) Sportsmanship Awards



Jonna elaborated on this year's Community Service Grant project – Rotary Row at Faye's Field. BRC has a special fondness for this greenspace that's part of the Learning Campus – it's named for the late Faye Clow, head

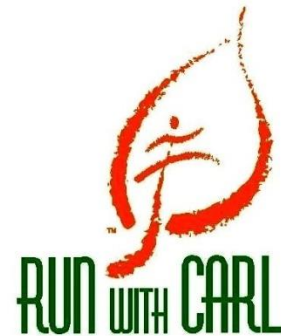
librarian at Bettendorf Public Library and BRC's first female president.

In the Rotary Row project, BRC is working with the Bettendorf Parks & Recreation Department to donate five sets of chimes that will be installed beside a pathway that curves through Faye's Field. The chimes are manufactured by All Inclusive Rec of Farmington, Mo. ([allinclusiverec.com/](http://allinclusiverec.com/)), a provider of park and playground equipment, such as what's used in other Bettendorf parks.

➔ **Rotary Youth Exchange: Harry Coin** presented a testimonial on the Rotary International program that brings students from one country into the homes of Rotarians in other countries for "a wonderful experience" – as is happening now in the Coin home. Harry shared his observations on "how well organized" the program – which placed a French student with the Coins this school year – operates. He encouraged any interested BRC member to get involved, and he'll help them learn more.

➔ **Run with Carl: President Jonna**

thanked all the BRC members who signed up to run, or volunteered to work, in Run with Carl, which steps off Monday – Labor Day – morning. BRC is a gold-



level sponsor, she added, and was the presenting sponsor for a number of years.

➔ **BRC Golf Outing:** With BRC's annual Golf Outing taking the place of next week's meeting, **Tim Lane** reminded members they can still sign up to eat grilled steak (or salmon) that evening.
