One Eighty
Prevent. Reach. Develop

Prevent. Reach. Develop. These three ideals provide the foundation for One Eighty and their purpose; to bring hope, love and opportunity to people and communities impacted by crisis, poverty and addiction.

Personal life experiences of homelessness, addiction and incarceration provided Founder and Executive Director, **Rusty Boruff**, with the vision to create One Eighty about six years ago. Today, One Eighty is on a mission to **prevent** crisis, poverty and addiction **before it happens**, **reach** those who are in crisis, poverty and addiction and **develop** those who were in crisis, poverty and addiction.

➔ **Prevent** reaches the youth, partnering with schools throughout the Quad Cities. "If we want to prevent people from needing help from One Eighty in their thirties and forties, we need to invest them while they are in third and fourth grade," says Boruff. This school-based initiative focuses on meeting the physical needs of the family through food pantries, athletic teams and school support. It is a tremendous opportunity

to build relationships and invest in kids and their families.

➔ **Reach** allows One Eighty volunteers to hit the streets of the Quad Cities to reach those in need. Their work extends from working with seniors in senior living/assisted living centers, to the homeless on the streets, to inmates in the local jails.

➔ **Develop** is the residential housing program for men and women with a troubled past who want to make a change. With a 91% success rate, the program has 55 resident spots available with a current waitlist of 14-months. Residents are put through an intensive one year directed study, work and mentoring program, spending 25 hours in classes and church plus 25 hours in the work program with One Eighty Enterprises; eight different businesses that have been set up to educate and train the residents for future employment opportunities. 100% of the proceeds from jobs goes directly to One Eighty to off-set operations cost for the nonprofit.

One Eighty is changing lives...from the inside out. They recently purchased an entire city block located at 6th and Marquette with an old school, church, homes and offices and are currently in the middle of \$1.5 million dollar campaign to purchase, renovate and invest in the community and people. Currently, the organization receives funding through private donations, events and local churches.

Charitable Grants Applications

BRC’s Charitable Giving Fund is seeking applications for grants of up to \$2,500 from qualified non-profit organizations in the Quad Cities, Jeff Hassel announced.

Application deadline is Oct. 1, 2016.

The Charitable Giving Fund accepts applications once a year from non-profit organizations that provide basic human services, serve youth or meet local community needs, Jeff explained. To be considered, an organization must complete the online application form at <http://www.bettendorffrotary.com/rotarygrants> by Oct. 1.



Funds for philanthropies come primarily from LobsterFest the 10th one was this June. Local not-for-profit organizations have received more than \$250,000 in grants during that time.

Grants are not awarded for annual fundraising, organizational endowments, deficit financing, grants to individuals, scholarship funds, political groups or activities, Rotarians and their families, or for sectarian purposes. Organizations that received funds last year are not eligible for the 2016 funding cycle. Jeff Hassel purchased the golf package which was auctioned. All proceeds from the event support the work of Bettendorf Rotary.

In evaluating applications, the Fund gives consideration to the following factors:

- Does the project serve Scott or Rock Island County?
- Does the program or project address a priority community need?
- Will the project have a significant impact on the need, what outcome will be achieved and how will it be measured? Will the Rotary funds have

a measurable impact on the project or organization?

- Does the program duplicate any other community service?
- Does the project have a sound financial plan?
- After this project is completed, how will funding continue? If not funded, what is the effect?
- Does the project have a base of community support such as volunteer involvement, neighborhood participation or collaboration with other organizations?
