RYLA helps build leadership skills

Four Bettendorf High School students – (from left:) **Eleanor Drexler, Alina Sepanski, Andrew Del Vecchio** and **Ben Tinsman** – attended the week-long Iowa Rotary Youth Leadership Academy (RYLA) last summer at Grinnell College, and they told us about their experiences during the Oct. 26 meeting.

With the four students passing the microphone among them to answer, guidance counselor Amy Harksen posed a series of questions – “Describe your first day,” “... a typical day,” “... the last day,” “... your biggest challenge” and “... the greatest take-away you brought back with you.”

None of the Bettendorf students went to RYLA with expectations. Greeted with hugs and people offering to take their bags, Eleanor found it “kind of overwhelming” at first, but eye-opening. About 250 sophomores- or juniors-to-be from across Iowa attended, and they were

divided into teams of 12, so all were compelled to quickly become acquainted with former strangers. From the first day, they also began to learn about Rotary, the 4-Way Test and “Service above Self.”

Throughout the week, the students attended sessions led by Rotarians, other community leaders and RYLA-graduate counselors. Team-building was a common theme – many activities stressed the need to work together to solve a challenge, they said. “The challenges took you out of your comfort zone,” Andrew said. “We had about a 30% chance of being blindfolded.”

Eleanor found one of those challenges her most memorable: “We were all blindfolded, and told to follow a rope to its end. But it had no end.” Finally, the students realized they had to ask for help.

Friendships with former strangers deepened through the week, they all said, while sessions taught them problem-solving and communication skills, and how to get along with people from many diverse backgrounds.

“We were not prepared at first to open up and share things about ourselves,” Alina said. But by later in the week, especially during a session called “Take a Look Around,” the students shared all sorts of issues they had dealt with – depression, loss of a family member, drug addiction. “We saw we are not alone in these problems,” Ben said as he labeled that his most memorable session.

In the end, along with leadership skills, they learned how to empathize with others and respect diverse viewpoints. And, as Alina said, “The Rotarians had a huge impact on us” – including applying the precepts of the 4-Way Test in their schools and daily lives.
