Program focuses on improving leader skills

RME programs 'almost double'

With the death in December of Ellis Kell, who had been the moving force behind Davenport's River Music Experience,

there was concern for the continuity of its educational programming. Current Programming Director **Brett Dale** relieved that concern at our Feb. 1 meeting. He said, "Ellis left us in great shape," emphasizing that programs, especially those designed to reach young



musicians, "have almost doubled" since Kell's passing.

Brett, who started working at the RME 7 years ago, after touring with legendary blues-man Lonnie Brooks, said Ellis encouraged him "to walk in my own shoes" – with his guidance.

And so he has pursued what he called "the coolest job in the world," reaching

kids with music education programs in schools and youth organizations as well as at the RME itself. He described some examples:



- → The River Currents Tour which has reached 26,000 Davenport 5th graders in its 10 years of existence brings kids to the Figge Art Museum for a half-day tour, with an emphasis on Mississippi River subjects. They move to the RME for lunch and another half-day of learning about all the genres of Mississippi Valley music culminating in an opportunity to "write their own blues lyrics," Brett said.
- → The Winter Blues Camp which was just renamed The Ellis Kell Winter Blues Camp brings kids into the RME daily for the week after Christmas to be taught how to play blues, soul and other river music. At the end of that week, the young musicians perform in the RME's Redstone Room, he said.
- → Brett, Ellis Kell and members of the Mississippi Valley Blues Society visited the school for special education students in East Moline three years ago. That school serves students from preschool through grade 12, Brett said. "Music is important to them, but their school board had cut all funding for music programs," he said. "So Ellis worked and found some funding, and we're now in year 3 of music education there."
