Each year the Bettendorf Rotary Club acts as host organization for the State of the City address by our own Mayor Bob Gallagher.

and the mayor's annual report to the city.

Visualize to help reach your goals

To emphasize her opening statement as featured speaker at our Feb. 8 meeting – “If you can't see it, you can't be it” – **Ginny Wilson Peters**, the principal of Integrity Integrated in Davenport, gave a little “quiz.”

She asked us to write on a blank piece of paper, “Which is the right answer in the following pairs of words?” The pairs:

- Cold / blue
- In the air / on the ground
- Metal / cloth
- Stars / planets
- Green / red
- Snow / white
- Stripes / plaid

Without being able to see how those words might relate to each other, it was

very difficult to pick the “right” answer, Ginny said – as she projected a picture of an American Flag on the screen, which made the right answers obvious. “So you have to visualize your goals,” she said.

After working a few years, she became the CFO of a Davenport company – and wrote her vision of what she would be doing 5, 10 and 15 years ahead. After becoming the owner of her current company (5 years), she saw herself as starting her own leadership development firm (10 years) and teaching leadership in the MBA program at the University of Iowa (15 years).

As it turned out, she reached that 15th-year goal just three years after writing the plan, she said, because “the vision helps guide you to realize those goals. And it helps you make decisions along the way.” So she was better prepared when she encountered opportunities that moved her toward her ultimate goal.



Ginny shared her guidelines for writing the statements in one’s own career vision:

1. Move toward something, not away, in statements that are clear and positive.
2. Ask for everything you want – don’t “sell yourself short.” And “push yourself to do things that you don’t think are possible. Set high goals.”
3. Persistently mark your progress toward goals.
4. Visualize yourself living in that ultimate outcome.
5. “Relax and release it” – have faith that it will happen that you reach your vision.
6. “Surround yourself with support,” that is, people who back you with positive support.

In conclusion, she said, “Pride will tell you it’s impossible...experience will tell you it’s risky... reason will tell you it’s pointless... but your heart will tell you, ‘Give it a try’.”
