**John DeDoncker presents
2017 ‘state of economy’**

For the last several years, **John DeDoncker**, Triumph Community Bank,



has presented a roundup of economic indicators and trends, compiling an annual “state of the economy” report. He will present his latest update on the economy at the April 5 meeting.

While the trends of the year since his latest report are a matter of history, it may prove more difficult for him to craft projections for the next 12 months of the Donald J. Trump administration. So far, one economic indicator, the stock market, rose in hopes that his pro-business campaign promises would aid the economy, yet fell back when he failed to deliver on his first campaign promise, to “repeal and replace ‘Obamacare’.” Other issues that will impact the 2017 economy certainly lie ahead.

**Red Cross aids
human suffering**

In her remarks at the March 29 meeting, **Amber Wood**, executive director of the American Red Cross division that serves the Quad Cities and west central Illinois, outlined the seven fundamental principles that guide the organization’s work and decisions. She also described several programs that apply those principles to help people in times of distress.

Health and safety are perhaps the top priorities in Red Cross programs, Amber said, noting how many of them focus on helping people after a disaster, whether it affects many, such as a flood, or impacts just one family, like a house fire. The top Red Cross campaign, therefore, focuses on home fires. Nationally, she pointed out, they occur an average of 17 times per day, cause some 2,500 deaths and cause damage in the billions of dollars.

To reduce the number and impact of home fires, she said, the Red Cross carries out educational programs so people learn ways to make their homes safer and promotes the use of smoke alarms. Last year in the QC region, the Red Cross provided a smoke alarm to a family of seven – who all survived a fire that happened to occur less than 12 hours later, she said.

At the whole-community level, Amber said the Red Cross aids disaster-response planning so neighbors can help neighbors respond quickly in case of a flood or tornado, for example, as well as work effectively with Red Cross-trained volunteers from outside the affected community.

Early in her presentation, Amber noted the range of Red Cross programs – from blood donation to CPR (cardio-pulmonary resuscitation) training – and BRC members have participated in many of them.

The seven fundamental principles that guide the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement are:

→Humanity: “...to prevent and alleviate human suffering...”

→Impartiality: “... guided solely by [the individuals’] needs, and to give priority to the most urgent cases...”

→Neutrality: “...not take sides in hostilities or engage at any time in controversies...”

→Independence: “... The (Red Cross) ... must always maintain (its) autonomy...”

→Voluntary service: “...not prompted in any manner by desire for gain”

→Unity: “...only one Red Cross... Society in any one country...”

→Universality: “The International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, in which all Societies have equal status and share equal responsibilities...”

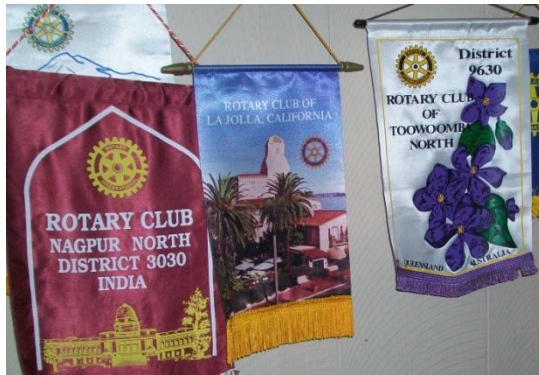

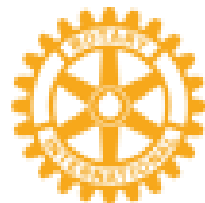
