Learn about QC Criterium, a Memorial Day tradition

The Quad Cities Criterium, a 52-year Memorial Day weekend tradition run by the Quad Cities Bicycle Club, will run the hills of the Village of East Davenport as it has since 2014 – and club member **John Harrington** will tell us more about it at the May 17 meeting.



This year it will be known as the Kwik Star Criterium because Kwik Trip, Inc. has signed on as title sponsor.

The Quad Cities Criterium was first run as the

Moline Criterium in 1965 and has evolved over time, landing on Memorial Day in 1975.

Since then it has joined with other area races to form the Memorial Day Bike Race Weekend series with races in Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri and Wisconsin.

How USO serves military in QC

At the May 10 meeting, we learned how the USO of Illinois serves active-duty, Guard and Reserve military members and their families at its five centers in the state – two at Chicago's O'Hare Airport, and one each at Chicago Midway, Great Lakes Naval Base and, the newest, Rock Island Arsenal.

Chris Miller, director of center operations, and **Jackie Inman**, director of the Rock Island USO center, reported that they served more than 300,000 service and family members through a number of programs. But they didn't do it alone – some 660 volunteers contributed more than 50,000 hours to support them.

More than 52,000 military families live in the Rock Island USO's service area – a



150-mile radius from the QC, which includes nearly the eastern half of Iowa. The

Rock Island USO “bridges between the military and civilian communities,” Jackie said, and carries out programs that especially help the spouses and children of military members; those include:
→Discovery Kids, a series of joint-USO-WQPT Quad-Cities Public TV events that take 3-10-year-old military children to such places as the Putnam Museum for an after-hours “scavenger hunt” where they learned about area history, Jackie said.

→USO Camp R&R, a free week-long vacation for military personnel and their family where they relax and rest on a Wisconsin lake; “We got to know each other again” after several year-long deployments, one soldier commented on a video about the program.

→Regular monthly get-togethers for Arsenal personnel and their family members

Jackie is the only employee of the Rock Island USO, which receives no funds from the government or the national USO organization. The center relies on support from QC sponsoring businesses and donors. To learn more about volunteering, donating or sponsorship, go to usofillinois/getinvolved.
