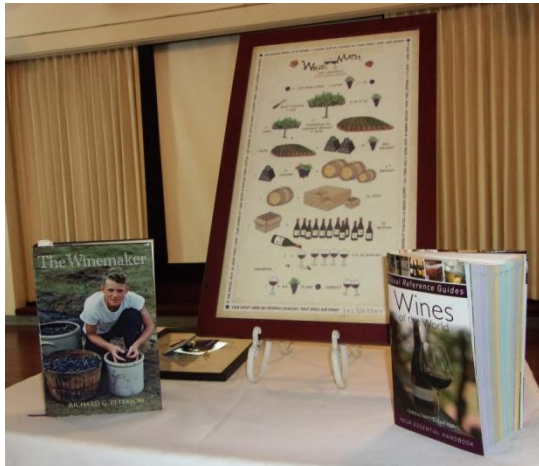
Learning more about wines...

Chris Griffin of Dimitri Wine & Spirits, Davenport – a consistent supporter of our LobsterFest – enriched our knowledge of wine during the June 14 meeting. He began by informing us that Americans are the No. 1 consumers of wine in the world.

Wine has been part of the human diet for at least 6,000 years, Chris said, based on discoveries in the area now known as Palestine in the eastern Mediterranean. The ancient Egyptians refined it and included it in tombs, presumably to be available to pharaohs in their after-life. Greeks during the Classic period enjoyed wine and extended its consumption around the Mediterranean basin and

beyond. Spanish and Portuguese explorers extended it to the Western Hemisphere and around the globe.

Through all that time, Chris said, wine itself has remained essentially the same, chemically: “Yeast converts the sugar in grape juice into alcohol.”



During a wide-ranging presentation followed by more questions from members than most speakers receive, we learned, among many other things:

→ Wine bottle styles denote the type of grape from which the wine was made, he said: High-shoulder bottles contain red wines from Bordeaux grapes, such as Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot or Malbec. Slope-shoulder bottles denote Burgundy-region red wines, including Pinot Noir and Beaujolais. Very tall bottle necks contain white wines, such as Riesling, Chardonnay and Chablis.



→ Temperature is an important factor in storing wine, he said. White wines should be kept cool, around 45 degrees, while reds should be at “room temperature,” 65 degrees or so. Keep Champagne ice-cold,

he advised. Most important, he added, is that the temperature “needs to be constant,” say a 55-60-degree basement.

→ Tracing the trip from grape to glass – grape – bunch – vine – acre – vineyard – etc. – Chris said it takes, on average, 630 grapes to produce one glass.

→ While every state has a wine-growing industry, California’s Napa and Sonoma counties with their ideal soils and climates are the best known and most productive. He said “Marquette” is the best Iowa grape.

→ Decanting red wines to aerate them accentuates the flavor, he advised.

→ All grape juice is clear, but the grape skin is the source of the wine’s color.

→ Sadly, we can’t save money by buying directly from Dimitri, because, as a distributor, it sells only to businesses with a liquor license.

To learn more about wines, Chris recommended a book, *The Winemaker*, by California wine industry veteran, and native Iowan, Richard G. Peterson (richardgpeterson.com/).

➔ **Gross income blew the doors off the previous record: President Jonna Schuler** called six volunteers to the front of the room, and gave a number to five of them and a dollar sign to the sixth.



Before that, Jonna reported that the 2015 LobsterFest gross income was \$60,900, and that last year's pre-expenses take had been

\$67,884. So, how, she asked, do you think these six members should be lined up? No one disagreed that dollar-sign **Bill Daley** should be first.

But it took a couple more minutes to learn that the proper order for the rest was: **Kevin Kraft, Keith Worner, Sharon Sarver, Joe Pacha and Ron Crist** – which equaled... (drum roll, please)... **\$85,731!**



We still have to subtract expenses, Jonna said, but the final *net* income has a chance to exceed last year's *gross*.
