SCC cooks up a yummy BASH..

Scott Community College held its first fundraising BASH 10 years ago, and our own **Lyn Cochran**, its president, and **Lisa Heglynd**, director of its foundation, came to our Aug. 22 meeting to tell us what’s new this year.

Actually, what’s new is what’s old, Lisa said, as she explained: “The first two years the SCC BASH was called the Home Grown Iron Chef Competition.” Each year two local chefs competed by preparing a “mystery” protein – she said, “It could have been snake, bear, octopus...” – and paired the meat with produce from a local farmers market.

This year, while the four chefs from those earlier years are back, she said the format

is tamer, but no less delicious. The event – scheduled for 5-8:30 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 4, at the Waterfront Convention Center – will feature appetizer stations throughout the Waterfront. After guests roam the site to browse silent-auction and



raffle items, they'll sit down to "a delicious dinner that will be prepared and served family-style at

your table with the help of the college's culinary arts and hospitality management students."

That is one of Scott Community College's top three programs; the others are truck driving and nursing, Lyn explained. Each BASH aims to upgrade the college's programs. The truck driving program recently received new semi-trucks and trailers to replace its aging fleet used in training new drivers.

SCC has another objective in mind at this BASH, the college officials said. Students who are veterans are leading efforts to create a memorial wall of blown-glass art dedicated to their fellow veterans who have fallen to suicide.

Lyn and Lisa displayed one of the blown-glass pumpkins being sold for \$55 apiece to fund the memorial wall and sustain a glass-blowing program at the college.
